HORSE & CART PUMPKIN SOUARES

1 - 13oz can evaporated milk
 3 - eggs, beaten
 2 tsp - pumpkin pie spice
 ½ tsp - salt
 1 cup - sugar

¾ cup butter
1 pkg. yellow cake mix
1 cup – walnuts
1 lg. can – pumpkin
cinnamon

Combine milk, eggs, spice, salt, sugar & pumpkin. Pour into greased 9×12 cake pan. Sprinkle dry cake mix on top. Slice butter over top and sprinkle with nuts & cinnamon. Bake at 350 degrees for about 50 minutes.
