To qualify for NPHC Year-end awards, members must comply with the rules as outlined in the 2010 Nevada Paint Horse Club Rules and Regulations. These rules are in the 2010 NPHC Directory and posted on the NPHC website at www.nevadapainthorseclub.org.

RED - Required

To qualify for 2010 NPHC Year-end awards, each eligible member must exhibit under at least eight (8) NPHC sponsored judges at the above listed shows, shown in red, for each individual event.

This requirement shall include exhibiting at, at least, one of the NPHC's two (2) judge shows, either June 4th & 5th or September 17th & 18th.

In addition, each member must attend and personally sign in at at least two (2) business meetings during the year 2010.

To qualify for any class award, a minimum of four (4) points must be earned.

ONLY classes at the above four shows will count for NPHC class, High Point, or Special awards.

If you qualify for year-end awards, the cut-off deadline for requesting your rewards will be November 25, 2010.

Blue - Bonus

The two (2) ENPHC shows listed above, that will be held in Fallon, NV, have been approved by the NPHC Board of Directors for the 2010 show season and to count towards the yearend class points.

The points that you earn at these two shows are considered bonus class awards points.

Exhibiting at either of these two (2) shows will NOT count toward your eight (8) judge NPHC requirement (to qualify for year-end awards). In addition, the points earned at these two shows will count only for individual class standings. These points will not be counted for Overall, High-point, or Special year-end awards by the NPHC.
